Among his many honors and awards have been the Christopher Medal, ABBY Award, International Reading Association Book of the Year, Minnesota Book Award, Midwest Publishers Association Book of the Year, Parent's Choice Award, Barnes and Noble Star of the North, and Story Telling World Award.

Among Doug's recent books are *Old Turtle and The Broken Truth*, sequel to the Award Winning Classic *Old Turtle*; the new "The Wisdom of Nature" series, small inspirational books for adults; *The Secret of Saying Thanks* — children, inspirational; and *Nothing to Do*, a children's book about the joys of unscheduled free time. Doug's Spring 2009 release, *Miss Little's Gift*, is the story of Doug's difficulty in learning to read, and of his most inspirational teacher.

Douglas Wood performs across the country, reaching audiences of all ages with a superb blend of storytelling and musicianship, personal warmth and lighthearted humor, and the rare ability to lift the human spirit.

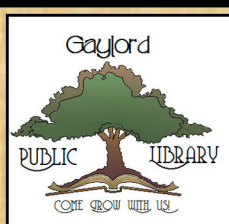
